Biography

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Dr. Farber has focused on research into pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH) and the clinical care of PAH patients for over 20 years. He has received numerous grants (both basic science and clinical) and has an extensive publication record in this area, including articles in peer reviewed journals such as *Circulation*, *New England Journal of Medicine*, and *Chest*.

Dr. Farber serves on many panels for the development of clinical recommendations in PAH, has participated in large multicenter clinical trials, and was on the Steering Committee of the REVEAL Registry (Registry to Evaluate Early and Long Term PAH Disease Management), the largest registry of PAH patients ever created. His research interests include endothelial cell biology, in particular, the response of the pulmonary vasculature to injury.

After earning a medical degree at George Washington University School of Medicine, Dr. Farber completed an internship and residency at the Medical College of Virginia and a fellowship at Boston University.

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
